PRECAUTIONS FOR USE

Appropriate engineering controls:

General Exhaust Ventilation adequate.

Glasses:

Safety Glasses. Consider full face-shield.

Gloves:

1.BUTYL 2.VITON 3.TEFLON 4.PVA

Respirator:

Type AK-P Filter of sufficient capacity. (AS/NZS 1716 & 1715, EN 143:2000 & 149:2001, ANSI Z88 or national equivalent)

Storage and Transportation:

Store in cool, dry, protected area. Restrictions on Storage apply. Refer to Full Report. Keep locked up. Keep out of reach of children. Keep away from living quarters. Keep away from food, drink and animal feeding stuffs.

Fire/Explosion Hazard:

Toxic smoke/fumes in a fire.

PROPERTIES

Liquid. Does not mix with water. Corrosive. Alkaline.Combustible.

EMERGENCY

FIRST AID

Swallowed:

Give water (if conscious). URGENT MEDICAL ATTENTION.

Eye:

Wash with running water (minimum 15 mins). Medical attention.

Skin:

Flood body with water. Remove contaminated clothing. Wash with water

Inhaled:

Fresh air. Rest, keep warm. If breathing shallow, give oxygen. Medical attention.

Advice To Doctor:

Treat symptomatically. Irrigate eyes with saline. Supportive care.

Fire Fighting:

Water spray/ fog. Foam - alcohol type.

Spills and Disposal:

Eliminate ignition sources. Prevent from entering drains. Contain spillage by any means. Absorb with dry agent. Stop leak if safe to do so. This material and its container must be disposed of in a safe way. To clean the floor and all objects contaminated by this material, use water and detergent.
